LACASA Garden Tour Committee OUR OBJECTIVES

People often ask how we select the gardens featured during this annual charity event. We take many things into consideration and strive to:

- Showcase the best variety of gardens in Livingston County
- Select gardens created by the homeowners (not professionally landscaped)
- · Include a mix of gardens in city, suburban and country locations
- · Consider the use of color, texture, plant varieties and creativity
- Choose gardens that inspire guests with ideas for their own yards
- Ensure that locations are safely accessible for people of all ages



- 4,610 nights of emergency housing in our Crisis Shelter
- 1,449 nights of safe hoteling to meet increased demand during the pandemic, which maintained our commitment of never turning away a victim in need of shelter
- 8,957 meals for victims and their families at both on-site and off-site locations
- 791 nights of Safe Pet Place shelter to protect family pets from abusers
- 8,882 nights of secure, off-site transitional supportive housing
- 186 child forensic interviews provided for suspected victims of child abuse
- 114 foster children served by our Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) program
- 215 sexual assault victims received immediate help at our Sexual Assault Response Center
- 757 legal assistance sessions provided for abuse victims by our legal advocates
- 50,000+ community members & students reached through our awareness & prevention programs

1 WICK GARDEN

409 E. Clinton Street, Howell Nearest Crossroad: Barnard

This versatile yard displays both sun and shade gardens incorporating annuals and perennials, so there's always something blooming.

Evergreen specimens such as Weeping Norway Spruce, Nootka Cypress and Baby Blue Spruce provide year-round interest. Enjoy the collection of butterfly bushes and an assortment of hydrangeas and roses. Lastly, be sure to visit the fish pond, which features a small waterfall and stream.

Accessibility: Clinton St. is under construction. Follow parking signage & volunteers will guide your short walk.

HUFNAGEL GARDEN

2946 W. Amberly Blvd., Howell Nearest Crossroads: Eager and Golf Club, Eager and M59

This gorgeous garden offers something for everyone. Tenderly cared for beds surround the house and line the street. An assortment of dwarfed trees and shrubs, along with a mix of perennials and annuals, gives character to these decorative gardens. Enjoy varieties such as coneflower, bee balm, hollyhock, hibiscus, delphinium, daisy, bugleweed, catmint, clematis, and hydrangeas.

Accessibility: Home sits sideways on a hill; use grassy areas

3 SPECIALTY GROWERS

4330 Golf Club Road, Howell Nearest Crossroad: Latson Rd

A "perennial" Garden Tour stop, this home-based nursery specializes in high quality perennials,

herbs, and annuals. Wander the display gardens, which include ornamental grasses, deer-resistant and drought-tolerant plans, hybrid daylilies, and lush hosta beds. Stroll paths of Michigan wildflowers, designed to attract butterflies. This is the perfect place to purchase unusual plants that thrive in our region.

Accessibility: Grassy walking area
Restroom: Outdoor privy available
Parking: Paved lot; some parking in front

4 CONDON GARDEN

3466 Snowden Lane, Howell Crossroads: Grand River and Latson

This "Hidden Garden" offers something for everyone. A stone path winds through the

wooded yard featuring hostas, Gooseneck Loosestrife, daisies, hydrangeas, Lamb's Ear, and trumpet vines. Two outdoor fireplaces, pergolas, a multi-level deck, and three stone/brick patios make this outdoor oasis a gardener's dream.

Accessibility: Stone stairs

Special Features: Stairs and boulder walls create a serene entrance to

5 BLACKWELL GARDEN

2280 Ore Creek Lane, Brighton Crossroads: Hacker and Hyne

A unique gem, this garden exhibits creativity and variety. Roses, hydrangeas, hostas, and heliotropes meander throughout the yard, as well

as a Big Bear's Breech. Be sure to explore the waterscapes behind this home. Birdhouses, stepping stones, and décor accentuate this one-of-a-kind garden wonderland.

Accessibility: House sits on a hill; use stepping stones or walk on the grass

Special Features: Natural pond behind the house, as well as a waterfall & stream, which feed into a manmade Koi pond

6 KLESKY GARDEN


2311 Ore Creek Lane, Brighton Crossroads: Hacker and Hyne

Special Features: Koi pond with small waterfalls


